THIS FALL - PREPARE FOR DISASTER & BEASTS



For the last couple of months in worship we've been working through the earliest days of the church through the opening chapters of Acts of the Apostles. IIt might take a year to preach Acts, but I probably wouldn't enjoy that year very much. Don't get me wrong; I love Acts. But there's more to the Bible!

I've spent the year thinking (and discussing with a few people) that this is an election year. This Fall, we will likely need to balance being a launching pad into our mission field with being a sanctuary from the division in our world. We'll all need a safe, politics-free, Christ-centered zone where our brains and hearts can rest.

With those things in mind, I'd pleased to announced our two Fall sermon series. First, we'll look toward the end of Acts, the 27th chapter, and learn about Paul's extraordinary shipwreck story. We'll take the story bit by bit, diving into the leadership and discipleship lessons we can learn from Paul's harrowing and accidental journey to Malta. On the last Sunday of that series, we'll discuss Paul's snakebite, which will help us pivot into the next series -Wild Word: Animals of the Bible.



Through October and November, I will be preaching about animal stories of the Bible. From the most domesticated to the most exotic, we'll be covering some of the interesting animal stories of the Bible. With footage from the zoo and a little bit of help from you, we'll be able to learn more about the Bible, God's good creation, and the interplay of science and the Bible during the seven week series. We'll talk about why the Hebrew Scriptures often mentions horses dying with their riders, an animal that made Biblical translators scratch their heads, and why being called a cow from a certain town was the worst insult.

You can help this series by bringing/sending in photos of your dogs to the office. We'd love to have a great montage of our canine companions for the Sunday we discuss a story of Jesus that involves domesticated dogs.

As always, I look forward to the next few months with you as we take a break from the world to focus on worship and equip each other for service to the world God so loves.

Last Friday evening a group from our church, by invitation, celebrated Shabbat with the congregation of Temple Israel. The gracious hospitality of our hosts began when we were welcomed at the door and given an explanation of the worship service we were about to experience. In the sanctuary, surrounded by the stained glass shared heroes of our faiths, the ancient Jewish ritual, perhaps the very same words heard and spoken by Jesus, was recited, sung, chanted, and read in unison. A highlight for many of us was the opening of the ark and the removal of one of the huge scrolls of the Torah, protected in its beautiful cloth sheath. A lay person carried the Torah around the congregation, where no one turned their back to the scriptures, and a lay person read from Deuteronomy and taught her interpretation of the verses. Following the worship service, the congregation extended to us even more hospitality with a time of fellowship and refreshment. We truly experienced Shabbat Shalom.
